

Martin Guzman is a Research Associate at Columbia Business School and a Professor of Economics at the University of Buenos Aires. He holds a M.A and a PhD in Economics from Brown University, and a B.A and M.A. in Economics from the University of La Plata. His research fields are Macroeconomics and Economic Development, with a focus in the study of the resolution of public debt crises.

He has advised the United Nations General Assembly on issues of sovereign debt restructuring and their implications for economic development.

Together with Joseph Stiglitz, he currently co-chairs Columbia University Initiative for Policy Dialogue's Taskforce on Debt Restructuring and Sovereign Bankruptcy.

He is also a member of the Institute for New Economic Thinking Research Group on "Macroeconomic Externalities and Instabilities" based at Columbia University, a non-resident Senior Fellow at the Centre for International Governance Innovation (Canada), and a non-resident Senior Fellow at Espacios Abiertos and the Center for a New Economy of Puerto Rico.

He is the editor in chief of the Journal of Globalization and Development, one of the most prestigious journals in the fields of economic globalization and development.

His research and articles have been prominently featured by the international media, as for instance in The New York Times, The Washington Post, The Guardian, Project Syndicate, and The Huffington Post, among others. His articles have been translated to more than a dozen languages.

He has lectured and given seminars in the most recognized universities and policy institutions worldwide, in more than 25 countries.
